David's Kingship is Threatened - Absalom Dies

Scriptures: 2 Samuel 13:37 – 2 Samuel 19

Key Verse: 2 Samuel 22:48 "It is God who avenges me, who subdues the people under me, who delivers me from my enemies...."

Key Points:

- 1. David's son Absalom, killed his brother Amnon for an evil thing he had done to their sister. Absalom fled Jerusalem because of the killing. David missed him very much and sent for him to come back.
- 2. Absalom was very handsome; he had long, strong hair. He was proud and rebellious against his father. He conspired to be king and to overthrow his father David. He gathered support throughout the tribes of Israel and his forces were great in number.
- **3.** David hears of Absalom's plan. He, his household, and army fled Jerusalem, across the Jordan to safety. Two of David's servants, Jonathan and Ahimaaz, stayed behind to keep track of Absalom's activities. They were found out, but a woman hid them in a well and placed grain over them. They were then able to report to David. God keeps Absalom from pursuing David until he is able to regroup his troupes.
- **4.** David divides his army into 3 groups. He told them to deal gently with Absalom. There was a great battle, 20,000 men died.
- 5. Absalom, riding on a mule through thick woods, was caught by his hair in a tree and was left hanging in the branches. Joab, the leader of his army, discovers him and disobeying the king, kills him with his sword to retaliate for his rebellion of the king.

6. David's army had won the battle but David grieved for Absalom. He journeyed back to Jerusalem and reigned as king again. God's will was accomplished as he wanted David to be king, not Absalom.

***Teachers:

There is a lot of detail in these chapters. Younger children may be unable to absorb it all. Teach as much of it as you can, hitting the most important details.
