Elijah Fed By Ravens


Scriptures: 1 Kings 17

Key Verse: 1 Kings 17:24 "Then the woman said to Elijah, Now by this I know that you are a man of God, and that the word of the Lord in you mouth is the truth."

Key Points:

- 1. Word of famine came through Elijah the Tishbite, a prophet of God. God sends him to hide by the Brook Cherith so he will have water to drink during the famine, he also sends ravens to bring him bread and meat.
- 2. Eventually, the brook dried up so God comes to him again and sends him to a widow at Zarephath, who would provide for him.
- 3. As Elijah requests water and food from her, she tells him she only has a small amount of meal and oil. She had been gathering sticks so she could prepare the last amount of bread for her and her son. Then she thought they would die.
- **4.** Elijah tells her not to fear but, to make a cake for him then for her and her son for God said the flour and oil would not run dry until the end of the famine. She obeyed and it happened as the word of the Lord had said through his prophet.
- 5. After these things, the widow's son became very sick and was not breathing. Elijah took the boy to an upper room and laid him on his bed. He cried to the Lord, asking him why this tragedy had come to the woman's son. Elijah stretched himself over the child 3 times and prayed to the Lord to revive him. He came back to life, so his mother rejoiced and praised Elijah. She knew he indeed was a man of God.



Elijah's Raven


1 Kings 17:1-7

Materials needed:

Construction paper—black, scrap of red Glue Black thread Crayons or paint

Directions:

Cut two ravens out of black construction paper, and two pieces of meat out of the red paper. (See page 26 for patterns.) Glue raven pieces together, inserting 20-inch piece of thread as indicated. Glue meat between raven's beaks. Add raven's eyes with white crayon or paint. Hang in a window or suspend from the ceiling. Use as a visual or a craft.



Elijah on Mt. Carmel




Materials needed:

Construction paper—dark green, red, gray, brown, light blue Yarn—dark green Tempera paint Glue

Directions:

Cut twenty-four rocks from gray paper. (See page 24 for all patterns.) Use half of these to form an altar in the lower half of one sheet of green paper. Cut two sacrifices from red paper. Glue one of these on this altar. In second sheet of green paper, punch one hole 1 inch from top and one hole in lower half of paper, where altar will be placed. Glue rest of rocks together to form an altar. Place this over lower hole and glue only around edges. Also glue sacrifice to altar. Paint water around base of altar





with blue paint. Cut from brown paper and glue four barrels around edge as shown in sketch. Cut flame from red paper and add yellow highlights with tempera paints. Glue this to middle of 20-inch piece of green yarn. Thread yarn through holes with flame on top. Cut sky from blue paper and glue this around edges to top of paper. Glue green sheets together, back to back.


As you tell the story, start with the plain altar. Then turn paper over. Keep flame under "sky" until you tell about the fire coming down from Heaven to consume the sacrifice, the rocks, and the water. Then pull yarn, and flame will come down from "Heaven."




Introduction

During the famine, God told Elijah to ask a poor widow for food. "I have only enough flour and oil to make one cake for my son and me," said the widow.


