Some of these sermons are fairly lengthy, you are not expected to cover every detail, instead pick what you feel are the key points to address and cover those in your 30 minutes. Typical things to consider would include: the setting for the sermon (location, what was going on at the time, what is this being given in response to, etc.), who was the speaker/audience, what were the key points made by the speaker (you may choose to mention all the key points but focus your thoughts on only a portion of them due to time limits), what impact did this have at the time, how does it apply to us today. You do not need to address all these items but they are given to give you some ideas as you begin developing your thoughts.
