We were happy to have them with us, but I felt horrible, as they had very little privacy. I pray for these girls.

Robin and I gave them their own Bibles before they left. They had been borrowing Bibles when we would have family Bible time. I pray they will read their Bibles, know that God loves them, and they may one day have a relationship with Christ through obedient faith.

During the last four months, Natasha, who is in High School, and Jonathan, in Middle School, both have had to quarantine because each had been around a student who tested positive for Covid. During those times Natasha and Jonathan would have to learn from home using Google Classroom, a computer program through Google's website that is tied

to our local school system. Teachers are able to leave work for the children to do, and students are able to do school work through the website. There's nothing like person to person learning, but this is one option when person to person is not available. Needless to say, it's been a crazy time at the Huff house!

Several times we had children who were quarantined, but no COVID in our house until December. Did it hit with vengeance!—first poor Robin, and about week later myself. Natasha for a few days was down, lost sense of smell and taste for a week or so, and tested positive; that was her extent Jonathan tested negative. Lily did not get tested, but also lost taste and smell for some time. Robin seemed to get through it fairly quickly; but as lately her breathing has been sporadic. She was diagnosed with pneumonitis—inflammation of the lungs. The steroid antiinflammation meds makes her jittery. She is doing better—thank God and your prayers! I don't think I have ever been sicker, for longer, in my life. I am still building back stamina. The children will be off quarantine this weekend. During this, Tabitha & Natasha had to miss their Winter Choir Concert, and Jonathan had to miss the last few weeks of Basketball. With Lily and Abigail being homeschooled it didn't affect them drastically, as it did the other children.

As of December 26th, we have been blessed to have my great niece (Natasha, 16) and nephew (Jonathan, 14) a part of our family for the last 4 years! Sometimes it seems longer and other times not that long. Natasha has a part time job at the Eldon Drive In. Jonathan continues to grow—he is now 14 years old and wears a size 14 shoe. I so much appreciate my dear wife, who is mother and aunt to our 5 children. She is such a blessing!
