Triumphal Entry, Clearing of the Temple

Scriptures: Luke 19:28-48, Matt 21:1-17, Mark 11:1-19, John 12:12-25

Key Verse: Matthew 21:13: "And He said to them, 'It is written, My house shall be called the house of prayer, but you have made it a den of thieves."

Key Points:

- 1. Jesus and His disciples were traveling into Jerusalem, and Jesus sent the disciples ahead to find a donkey colt, and to bring it to Him. They did so.
- 2. They covered the colt with their blankets, and the Lord sat on it, and rode into Jerusalem on it, while the multitudes spread their garments and palm branches on the road ahead of him. They also shouted "Hosanna in the highest!" All of the city of Jerusalem was moved by this.
- **3.** When Jesus came into the temple, he saw the moneychangers there, and the sellers of doves, and he was very angry.
- 4. He overturned the tables of these men, and threw them out of the temple, accusing them of turning the house of God into a den of thieves.

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Jesus Goes to Jerusalem


Matthew 21:1-11 (NIV)

BEFORE CLASS

Duplicate a pattern page for each child. Cut three 1" x 8"

strips of paper for each child. Cut a 20" length of yarn for each child. Make a sample craft to show the children.




WHAT TO DO

- 1. Introduce the lesson by telling the story from Mark 11:1-11. Say, The people were happy to see Jesus. They loudly praised Jesus. We can praise Jesus, too.
- 2. Show the children the sample craft.
- 3. Distribute a pattern page to each child.
- 4. Say the memory verse.
- 5. Have the children tape the three paper strips to the back of the page at the bottom.
- 6. Have the students color the page.
- 7. Help the children fold the page into a triangle shape and tape the edge.
- Punch two holes along the top edge and thread yarn through for a hanger. Say, When you hang up your windsock at home, remember to praise Jesus.




EXTRA TIME

Clearing the Temple

Mark 11:15-19, 27-33

As Jesus and His disciples entered Jerusalem, Jesus headed for the temple. When He entered the temple, He began to clear out the buyers and sellers, turning over the tables of the money exchangers. Jesus said to them, "My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations, but you have made it a den of robbers."

The chief priests and teachers of the law heard this, and they were afraid of Him. From that day on, they began plotting to murder Jesus.

Days later, as Jesus was entering the temple, the chief priests and teachers questioned Him. "Who gave you authority to do this?"

Jesus told them to answer one question: "John's baptism—was it from heaven, or from men?"

They discussed it among themselves and answered, "We don't know."

Jesus replied, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things."
