Paul and Barnabas Journey for Jesus (1st Journey)

Scriptures: Acts 13, 14:8-20 (also cover some background information on

Barnabas: Acts 4:36, 9:27, 11:22-30, and 12:25)

Key Verse: As they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Spirit said, "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

Key Points:


- At the church that was at Antioch, Paul and Barnabas were teaching. While they were fasting and ministering, the Holy Spirit spoke to them saying to separate themselves for the Lord's work. Having hands laid on them, they were sent out from Antioch to preach the Word of God, with John Mark as their assistant.
- On the island of Paphos, a sorcerer named Elymas, was with the governor of the 2. island, who came to hear Paul and Barnabas preach. Elymas resisted their words in an effort to turn the governor away from God. But Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, confronts him for perverting the Word of the Lord. Elymas is then struck blind. The governor, seeing these things, was astonished and believed. John Mark left them after these things and returned to Jerusalem.
- Paul and Barnabas went throughout the area, stirring people up with their **3.** preaching. Many believed, others were angry and threw them out of their region, even desiring to abuse and stone them.
- In the city of Lystra, a man who had been crippled from birth came to hear Paul preach. Paul seeing he had faith to be healed, told him in a loud voice to stand straight up on his feet. The man jumped up, leaped and walked.
- When the people saw this miracle, they thought Paul and Barnabas were gods, **5.** wanting to sacrifice to them. This was very distressing to them and Paul tried to make them understand that they were just regular men. The Jews in the area whipped up the multitudes against Paul and stoned him. They drug him out of the city, supposing him to be dead. When disciples gathered around him, he rose up and went into the city and left with Barnabas the next day.


Discussion Questions – Paul Heals a Lame Man Read Acts 14:6-18

Amazing Paul and Barnabas








Find the Cities of Paul's First Missionary Journey


Open the map and get your Bible. Follow Paul's first journey: Acts 13:1-14; 14:1, 6, 20-21, 25-26.




