Paul's Trial, Shipped to Rome

Scriptures: Acts 24:1-23, 25:1-12, 26: 1-32

Key Verse: Acts 27:23,24 "For there stood by me this night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve, "saying, 'Do not be afraid, Paul; you must be brought before Caesar; and indeed God has granted you all those who sail with you.'

Key Points:

- 1. Paul speaks before the Sanhedrin to defend himself. There was an uproar again, many arguing vigorously. It became so violent they took Paul to the barracks for fear he would be torn to pieces. They were angry because of Paul's teaching of the resurrection of the dead.
- 2. Forty men formed a plot to kill Paul. They vowed not to eat until he was dead. The son of Paul's sister heard about the plot and told the commander. The commander told him to keep it silent then sent 200 soldiers to take Paul safely to the Governor.
- 3. Paul was put on trial before Felix, the governor. After listening to Paul he adjourned the trial but he and his wife Drusilla met with Paul again. They listened to his faith in Jesus but it frightened Felix. He left Paul in prison for 2 years until his successor, Festus, came into power
- 4. Paul appears before Governor Festus and King Agrippa. He was happy to be able to speak for himself concerning the things he was accused of. He testifies how the Lord came to him on the road to Damascus and sent him out to teach to the Gentiles. When he spoke about Christ's resurrection, it made them angry again. Festus accused him of being mad. Paul told him he was not mad, but speaking truth and reason. He knew he had made an impression on King Agrippa and Paul ask him if he believed. Agrippa said that Paul almost persuaded him to be a Christian. They all got up and left, talking among themselves that Paul had done nothing worthy of death. Agrippa grants his request to appeal to Ceasar and Paul is shipped to Rome.






