Joseph, From Dreamer to Slavery

Scriptures: Genesis 37

Key Verse: Gen. 37:3 Now Israel loved Joseph more than all his children, because he was the son of his old age. He made him a tunic of many colors.

Key Points:

- 1. Jacob (Israel) and his sons lived in Canaan where they were strangers. Joseph was 17 years old and was feeding the flocks with his brothers. He brought a bad report to his father Israel (Jacob). Israel loved Joseph more than all his children because he was Rachel's son. He made him a coat of many colors. His brothers hated him because he was loved more.
- 2. Joseph had a dream where they were binding sheaves in the field and his brothers sheaves bowed down to his sheaf. He also had a dream where this time the sun, moon and 11 stars bowed down to him. His brothers hated him even more for his dreams. His father also rebuked him for his dreams.
- 3. Joseph's brothers went to feed the flocks at Shechem and Israel sent Joseph to see about them. When they saw him coming, they plotted to kill him. His brother Reuben urged his brothers not to kill Joseph; so instead they threw him into an empty water pit, stripping him of his coat.
- 4. Judah urged the brothers sell him to Midianite traders for 20 shekels of silver. They killed a goat and put the blood on his coat to show their father so he would believe Joseph had been killed. Israel mourned deeply for is son Joseph; he thought he would never see him again. Joseph, however, was sold to a man named Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh and captain of the guard.





Jacob had twelve sons. He loved Joseph more than the others and he made him a coat of many colors.






Bulletin Board for Summer

GROWING IN GOD'S FAMILY



Materials:

Construction paper—flesh, light blue, medium blue, dark blue, black, yellow
Thumbtacks or stapler
Felt-tip pens
Fabric scraps (optional)
Patterns—boy, girl (page 45)

Directions:

In the center of your board place yellow sheets of construction paper (or strips, depending on the size of the board) in a vertical line. Mark the yellow sheets with a black felt-tip pen to resemble a tape measure. Using the boy and girl patterns, cut figures from skintone construction paper, and from light blue, medium blue, dark blue, and black. Cut clothing from fabric scraps or from colorful paper. Cut large block letters to form the words *We are growing in God's family*, to be placed on board as shown.

Place the figures of the boy and girl on each side of tape measure with shadows progressing up tape measure, from light blue to black.

To one side of the bulletin board, put up a sheet of paper where you can measure each child as he comes in the first week. Mark his height and his name. Tell him, "You are getting big. You are big enough to learn how to help." Later he will be big enough to share, and to worship God, as those concepts are presented.

Lesson 1: How We Grow

JOSEPH STICK PUPPET

Materials:

Tagboard (such as file folders are made of)

Felt-tip pens Craft sticks—1 per child Fabric scraps Glue Pattern—puppet and clothing (page 48)

Directions:

Before class cut puppet figures using pattern on page 48. Add faces with felt-tip pens. Cut fabric scraps for coats.

During class have the children glue the puppets to the craft sticks and add the fabric coats for a touchand-feel effect.

Application:

Let the children role play the story of Joseph, using their puppets. You may need to suggest various actions that make up the story. Discuss with the children how God helps us grow the way He helped Joseph.

The same puppet would fit with a lesson on Samuel and the new coat his mother brought him each year, or could be any number of Bible characters.
