Pharaoh's Dreams

Scriptures: Genesis 41

Key Verse: Genesis 41:16 Joseph answered Pharaoh saying, "It is not

in me; God will give Pharaoh an answer of peace."

Key Points:

- 1. Pharaoh had 2 dreams. He had one dream about 7 fat cows coming up out of the river and eating up 7 skinny cows. The second dream was similar, 7 thin, blighted heads of grain devoured 7 plump, full heads of grain. These dreams troubled Pharaoh and no one could interpret the dreams.
- 2. The butler finally remembered Joseph and told Pharaoh how he had interpreted his dream. Pharaoh sent for Joseph and he interpreted his dreams for him. Joseph told Pharaoh there would be 7 years of plenty, then 7 years of famine that would eat up the 7 good years.
- 3. Joseph advised Pharaoh to set up a man to be over the land of Egypt and officers to collect one-fifth of the grain in the good years to save for the famine. Pharaoh recognized that God was with Joseph and that he was wise. He appointed Joseph to be over the land of Egypt and clothed him with fine clothing and jewelry.
- **4.** Joseph was 30 years old when he was put over Egypt. He had two sons during this time by his wife Asenath: Manasseh and Ephraim.
- 5. Joseph gathered much grain during the plentiful years. When the famine was over all the face of the earth, all the countries came to Joseph to buy grain for the famine was severe.






Joseph dream wheel ~ print on cardstock and cut out where indicated. Let the children color/and or find stickers to use on the wheel.


Fat cows/skinny cows \sim use paper plate folded over to make cow. You can fold them to be either fat or skinny.














As an adult, Joseph became a high official in Egypt.


When a great famine came over the land, people came to Egypt from all over to buy food.


Jacob sent his sons to find food in Egypt.

Joseph welcomed his brothers and told them that they could make their home in Egypt.


GENESIS - Chapter 41, Verse 55; Chapter 42, Verse 3; Chapter 47, Verrses 5-6

Genesis 41:36- "Then that food shall be as a reserve for the land for the seven years of famine which shall be in the land of Egypt, that the land may not perish during the famine."





CORN ON THE COB



Materials:

Construction paper—green and yellow White paper Glue Paintbrush-1" wide Felt-tip pen Pattern—corn husk (page 37)

Directions:

Ahead of time, cut yellow construction paper into 1/2" squares (like mosaic tiles). Cut green husks using the pattern. Print the words God gives us food on the husks. Draw a corn-cob shape, about 2" wide and 8" long on the white paper.

Let the children place the yellow squares on the corn-cob shape. The best way to do this is for you to paint glue on the area with a wide paintbrush before the child begins. When the child has placed as many corn kernels as he wants, let him glue the husk over the kernels. You may want to add the Bible words to the craft.

Application:

Talk about different foods. Ask the children what their favorite foods are. Say something like, "I am thankful God made (their favorite foods), aren't you?" Use this also as a Thanksgiving craft.

Clear, adhesive-backed plastic Felt-tip pen Paper punch Crayons Patterns—boat and sail (pages 37, 38)

Directions:

Before the session, cut a boat out of a sponge for each child. Make a small hole in the sponge for the straw to fit into. Cut a sail for each child out of construction paper. Print the words God gives us water on one side of each sail. Cover both sides of the sails with the plastic to make the sails waterproof. Punch two holes on the long side of each sail, where indicated. Cut straws to 7" in length.

Let the children decorate their sails with crayons. (The wax will stick to the plastic.) Give each child a straw and help him put it through the holes in the sail. Help him put the straw in the hole in the sponge.



Application:

Tell the children they can sail their boats in the bathtub when they take their baths. Their boats will remind them to thank God for giving them water to use and to drink. If you have several large containers in your room, the children will enjoy sailing their boats as a learning activity. This activity requires close supervision, but the children love it. Provide plastic bags for taking the boats home.

This boat can be used with any lesson that has something to do with water or with boats, such as a story on the missionary journeys of Paul.






Joseph Forgives His Brothers
