Jacob's Sons Second Journey to Egypt

Scriptures: Genesis 43

Key Verse: Genesis 43:2 And it came to pass that when they had eaten up the grain which they had brought from Egypt that their father said to them, "Go back and buy us a little food."

Key Points:

- 1. The famine was severe in the land and Jacob's family ran out of grain. They had to return to Egypt to buy food. That meant that they would have to take Benjamin back with them when they returned. This was very difficult for Jacob but he decided to let them go, praying that God would show them mercy and return his sons to him.
- 2. As they returned to Egypt, they took double their money to replace the money that was placed in their sacks. They also took fruits of the land as gifts.
- 3. Joseph made ready a meal for them. The brothers were fearful but explained that they had come again to buy food. They were invited in and again bowed down to Joseph (prophesy fulfilled again).
- 4. Joseph asked about their father but when he saw Benjamin he was overtaken with emotion and had to leave the room to weep.
- 5. When the meal was ready sat them at the table according to their birthright. The brothers were astonished by this. Benjamin's serving was 5 times larger than the others.





This time they took Benjamin with them.



The second time they came, Joseph gave his brothers a feast. He gave his younger brother, Benjamin, more than all the rest.


