Ruth

Scriptures: Ruth 1 & 2

Key Verse: Ruth 1:16 But Ruth said “Entreat me not to leave you, or to turn back from following after you; For wherever you go , I will go and wherever you lodge, I will lodge, Your people shall be my people, And your God, my God.”

Key Points:

- 1.** Elimelech and Naomi were from Bethlehem, Judah. A famine in the land caused them to travel to Moab with their two sons, Mahlon and Chilion. Elimelech died leaving Naomi alone with her two sons. They took wives from Moab, Orpah and Ruth. After about 10 years the sons died as well.
- 2.** Naomi decided to return to her homeland of Judah. She begged Ruth and Orpah to stay in Moab and return to their families, telling them she had no more sons for them to marry. Orpah did go back but Ruth refused, wanting to stay with Naomi. They returned to Bethlehem.
- 3.** Naomi had a relative of her husband, Boaz. He was very wealthy. Ruth was able to glean grain from his fields after the reapers had gone through. This supplied food and money for Naomi and Ruth to live on.
- 4.** Boaz noticed Ruth and asked who she was. He told her she could glean in his field only, and his servants could keep an eye on her. Boaz instructed his men to leave grain behind so that Ruth could glean more grain. Ruth asked him why he was so kind, he told her he heard how well she had treated her mother-in-law, how she left her family to care for her.
- 5.** Naomi was surprised Ruth gathered so much grain and that she was working in the field of one of her husband’s kinsman. God had been with them and blessed them.

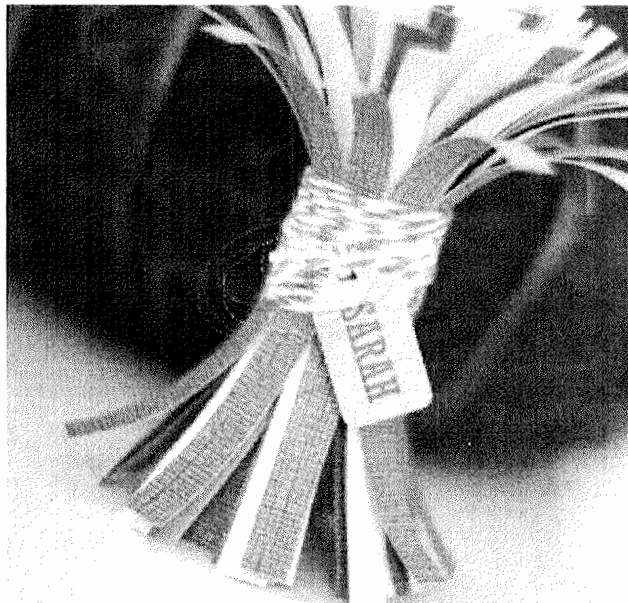
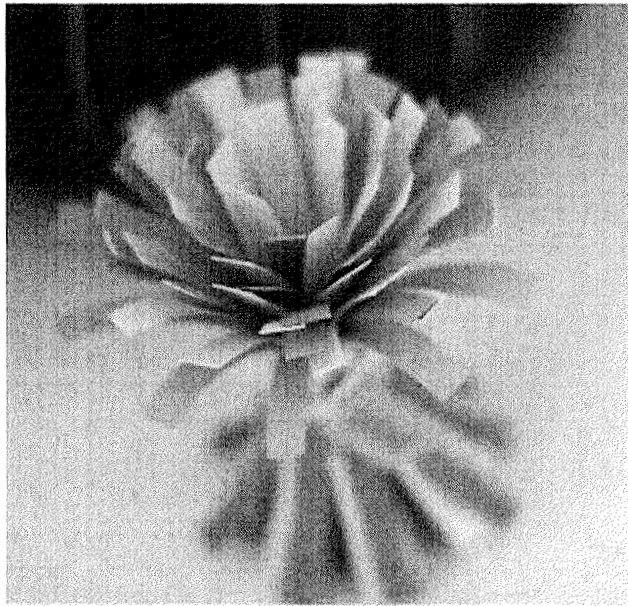
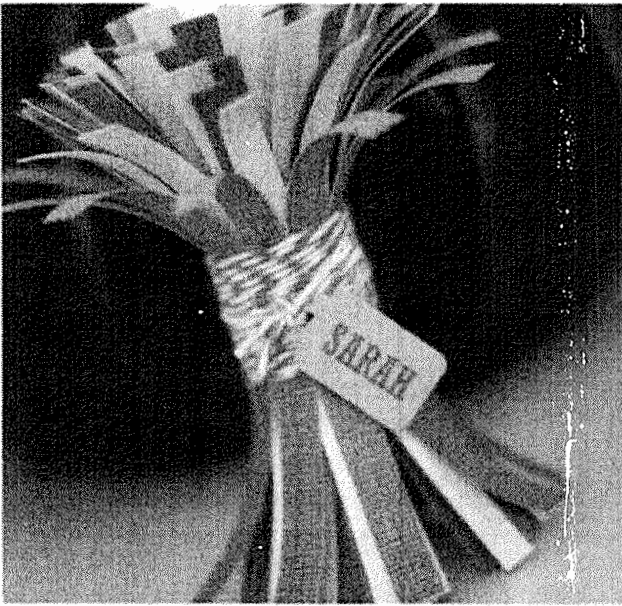


Make a Ruth Basket

If you could meet your great-grandparents, their parents, and all the people who came before you in your family, you might be surprised by what kind of people they were. In the Bible, one of Jesus' human ancestors was Ruth - a Moabite lady who used to worship idols.

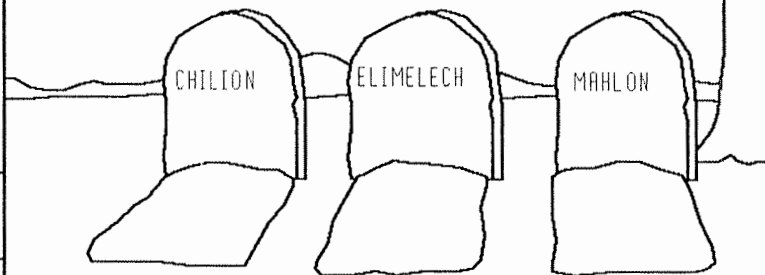

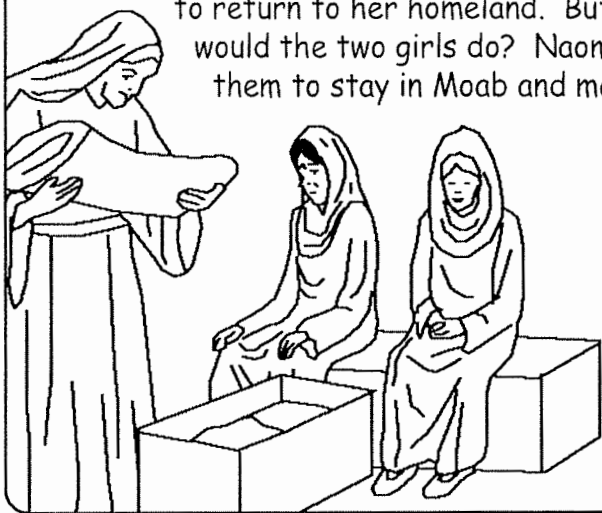
Things did not go well for Elimelech and his family in Moab. He died, followed by his two sons.



His wife, Naomi, was left, along with the sons' two wives, Ruth and Orpah. Both girls were from Moab.

Naomi, now a widow, heard that the LORD had visited His people, giving them bread. She decided to return to her homeland. But what would the two girls do? Naomi advised them to stay in Moab and marry again.

Orpah went back to her own family. But Ruth refused. Instead, Ruth said a lovely poem which promised she would never leave her mother-in-law.



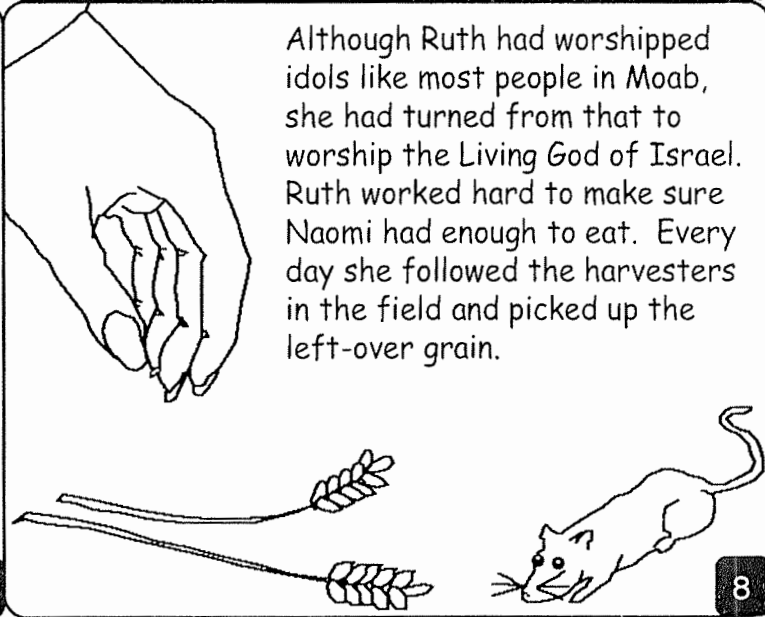

Naomi's old friends were glad that she had come home to Bethlehem. But she asked them to call her "Marah" (bitter) instead of Naomi (pleasant). "For the Almighty has dealt very bitterly with me." Naomi had returned with nothing - except Ruth.

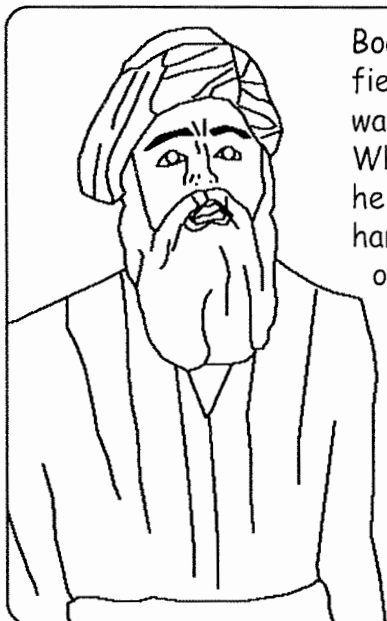

Although Ruth had worshipped idols like most people in Moab, she had turned from that to worship the Living God of Israel. Ruth worked hard to make sure Naomi had enough to eat. Every day she followed the harvesters in the field and picked up the left-over grain.

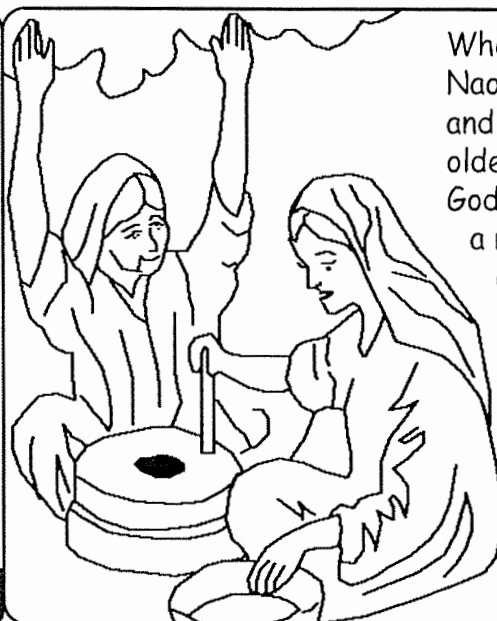

Boaz, the owner of the field, heard how good Ruth was to her mother-in-law. When he met her, Boaz helped her by ordering his harvesters to leave handfuls of grain behind on purpose. Boaz began to like Ruth.

When Ruth told Naomi about Boaz and his kindness, the older lady praised God. "The man is a relative of ours, one of our near kinsmen."

As time passed, Boaz wanted to marry Ruth and look after Naomi and her family's land. But another near relative had the first chance. This man wanted the land - but he didn't want Ruth for his wife. The law said he could not have one without the other.



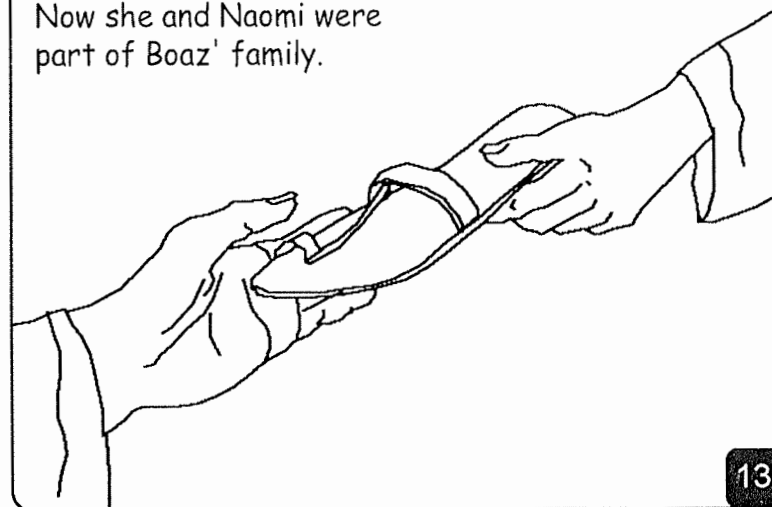

The business was settled. Ruth would become his wife. Now she and Naomi were part of Boaz' family.



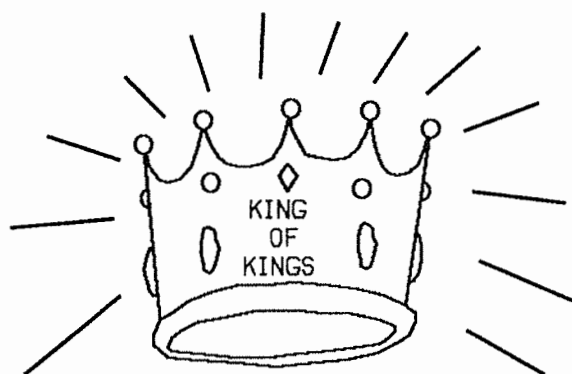

The Story of Ruth

A man named Elimelech took his wife Naomi and his two sons to the country of Moab because there was food in that land. Elimelech died, and Naomi was left as a widow with two sons. The sons married. One married a woman named Orpah, and the other married Ruth. After about ten years, the two sons died also. Naomi decided to go back to her home country, to the town of Bethlehem. Both of her daughters-in-law wanted to go with her, but she told them that they should stay in the land of Moab. Ruth insisted on going with her mother-in-law. The two of them went to Bethlehem. Naomi's friends were so glad to see her again! In those days, according to God's command, when a farmer harvested his field, he had to leave the grain that fell for the poor people to pick up. This gathering of the left-over grain was called "gleaning". Ruth went to "glean" in the field of a man named Boaz. He was a relative of Naomi's family. Ruth worked hard gathering grain to feed herself and Naomi. Boaz noticed how hard she was working and told her to stay in his field to glean. He invited her to eat with him and he said he would protect her from harm. Boaz wanted to marry Ruth, but there was another relative who had first choice of taking care of Ruth. The two men had a meeting. The other man decided that he couldn't take care of Ruth, so he took off his sandal, as the custom was, to seal an agreement. He told Boaz to buy the land and marry Ruth. They were married and later had a son named Obed. Obed, when he was grown, had a son named Jesse. Jesse's son was David. The great-grandson of Ruth became king of Israel, King David!
