Saul Loses his Crown

Scriptures: I Samuel 15

Key Verse: I Samuel 15:22 "...to obey is better than sacrifice and to heed than the fat of lambs."

Key Points:

- 1. Samuel came to Saul and tells him he is to completely destroy the Amalekites. Nothing was to be spared, <u>all</u> people, animals and possessions were to be destroyed. So Saul gathered all the people together and laid wait in the valley.
- 2. Saul attacked and destroyed the Amalekite nation but saved King Agag, their king. He also spared the best of the sheep, oxen, lambs, and fatlings. All that was good he spared, but destroyed all that was worthless.
- 3. God spoke to Samuel and told him he was grieved that he had set up Saul as king. Samuel then went to Saul. Saul was proud of himself but Samuel asked him about the bleating of the sheep that he heard. Saul still insisted he had obeyed the word of the Lord and had kept the animals to sacrifice. Samuel told him to be quiet and listen to what the Lord had told him. Saul then admitted to his sin and asked Samuel to forgive him and go back with him to worship the Lord.
- 4. Samuel refused to go with him. He had rejected the Lord and now the Lord was rejecting him as king.(fulfills prophecy Samuel makes in ch. 12 & 13). Then Saul reached out for him as he turned to leave. He caught hold of the hem of Samuel's robe and it tore. Samuel said to him that this was just like the lord "tearing" the kingdom of Israel from him. Saul asked again that Samuel worship with him so he did.
- 5. Samuel then killed King Agag as God had commanded. Saul went to his home. Samuel never saw Saul again but mourned for him. The Lord grieved he had ever made him king. God did not tolerate Saul's disobedience and expected him to follow the whole law, not just the parts he wanted to. Obeying is better than the sacrifice.


