God Chooses A New King


Scriptures: 1 Samuel 16

Key Verse: 1 Samuel 16:1 "Now the Lord said to Samuel, 'How long will you mourn for Saul, seeing I have rejected him from reigning over Israel? Fill your horn with oil, and go; I am sending you to Jesse the Bethlehemite. For I have provided Myself a king among his sons."

Key Points:

- 1. Saul, the first king of Israel had been rejected by God. God told the prophet, Samuel, to fill his horn with oil, travel to Bethlehem, and anoint one of Jesse's eight sons, whom God would select.
- 2. Samuel obeyed and met with Jesse and his 7 older sons at a sacrifice to God. All 7 of the older sons passed by Samuel, but God did not choose any of them. God told Samuel that man looked on the outward appearance, but God looked on the heart.
- 3. Jesse told Samuel that the youngest son was out tending the sheep. David was quickly brought in before Samuel. He was healthy, strong, and good-looking. God said, "Arise, anoint him for this is the one." David's heart (mind/will) was superior in God's sight (see Acts 13:22).
- 4. Samuel poured the oil out on David's head in the presence of his father and all 7 of his brothers. The Spirit of the Lord came upon David from that day forward. Anointing was pouring of fine oil on the head and letting it flow down on the body. God's royal blessings flowed down on David and covered him while he reigned as king of Judah and then all of Israel.

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LESSON 1

DAVID ANOINTED KING

I Sam. 16

INTRODUCTION. Because Saul disobeyed God in his expedition against the Amalekites by sparing Agag, the king, and the best of the animals, the Lord rejected him as king over Israel. Saul and Samuel each went to their own homes after the battle, and Samuel went to see Saul no more in his lifetime.

The Lord told Samuel to mourn no longer for Saul but to go on a secret mission to Bethlehem. There He instructed Samuel to anoint David, the youngest son of Jesse of the tribe of Judah, as the next king of Israel. Although God "rent" the kingdom from Saul, David did not actually become king until after Saul's death.


