The Good Samaritan

Scriptures: Luke 10:25-37

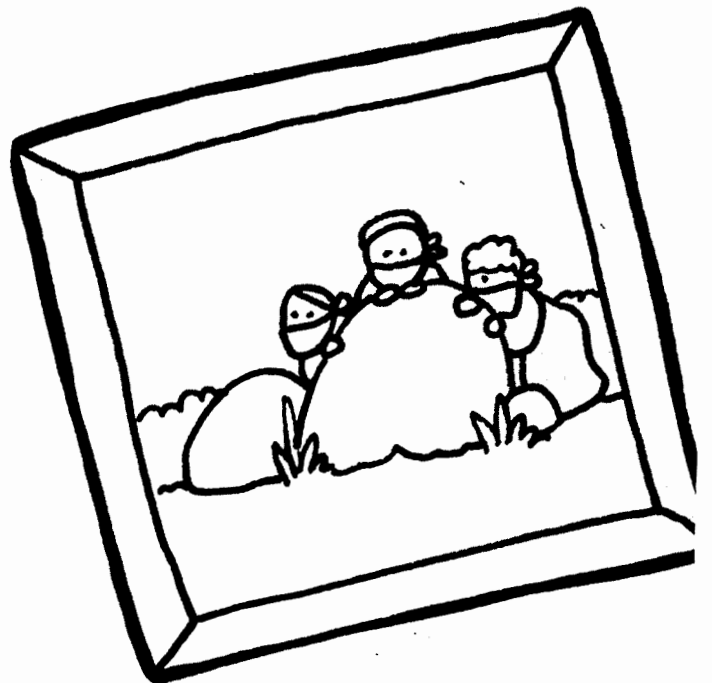
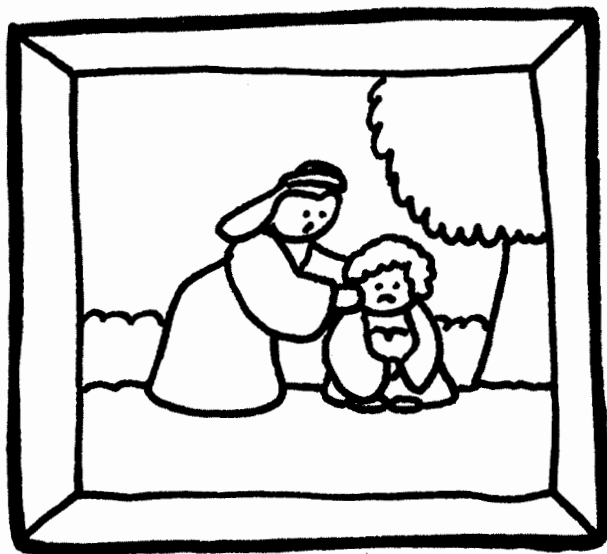
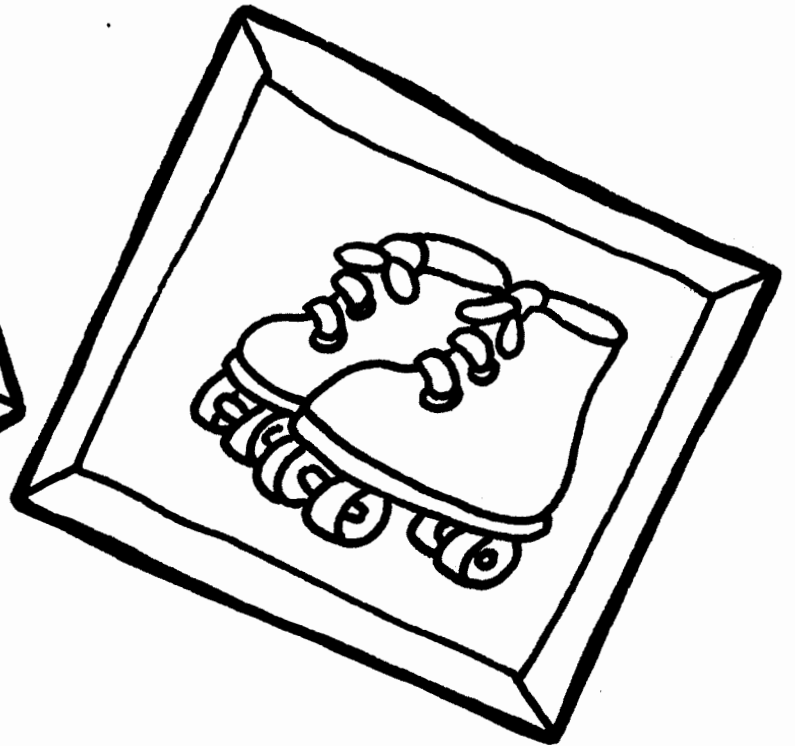
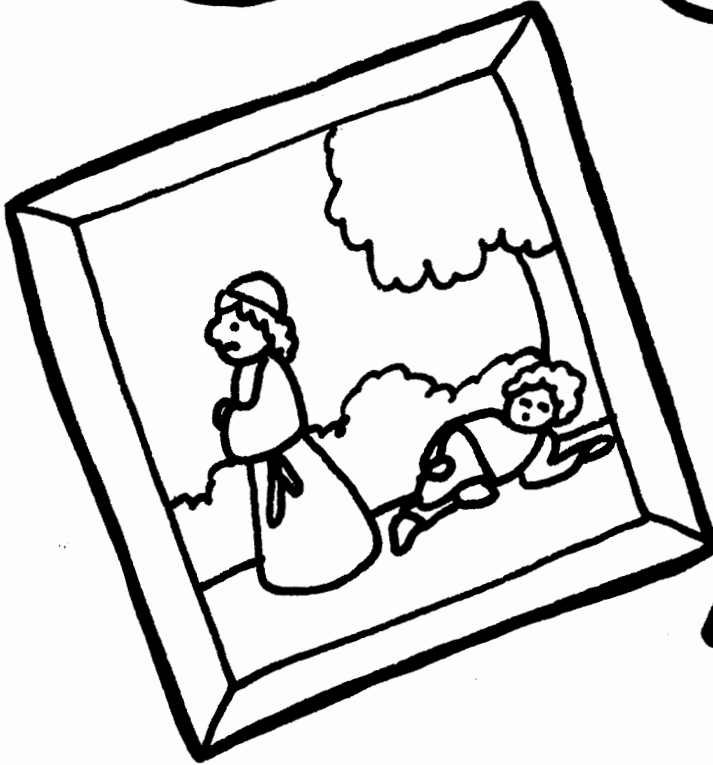
Key Verse: Luke 10:27: “You shall love the Lord thy God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with you’re your mind, and thy neighbor as yourself.”

Key Points:

1. A lawyer was questioning Jesus about what it took to inherit eternal life. When Jesus asked him what the law says, he quoted the old law, saying to love the Lord with all your heart, soul, strength and mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself.
2. Jesus said this was correct, and that he did well to follow these commandments. The lawyer then asked who his neighbor was. Jesus then told the story of the Good Samaritan.
3. A man traveling was attacked by thieves, beaten and robbed. While he was lying half dead on the road, a priest and a Levite passed by on the opposite side of the road. A Samaritan, whose people are not liked by the Jews, stopped, bound up his wounds, and took him to the inn.
4. When he left the inn the next morning, he left money for his care, and told the innkeepers that he would pay any additional costs when he returned.
5. Jesus then asked the lawyer which of these three men was a neighbor to the man that fell among the thieves.
6. The lawyer answered the one that cared for him. Jesus told him to go and do likewise.

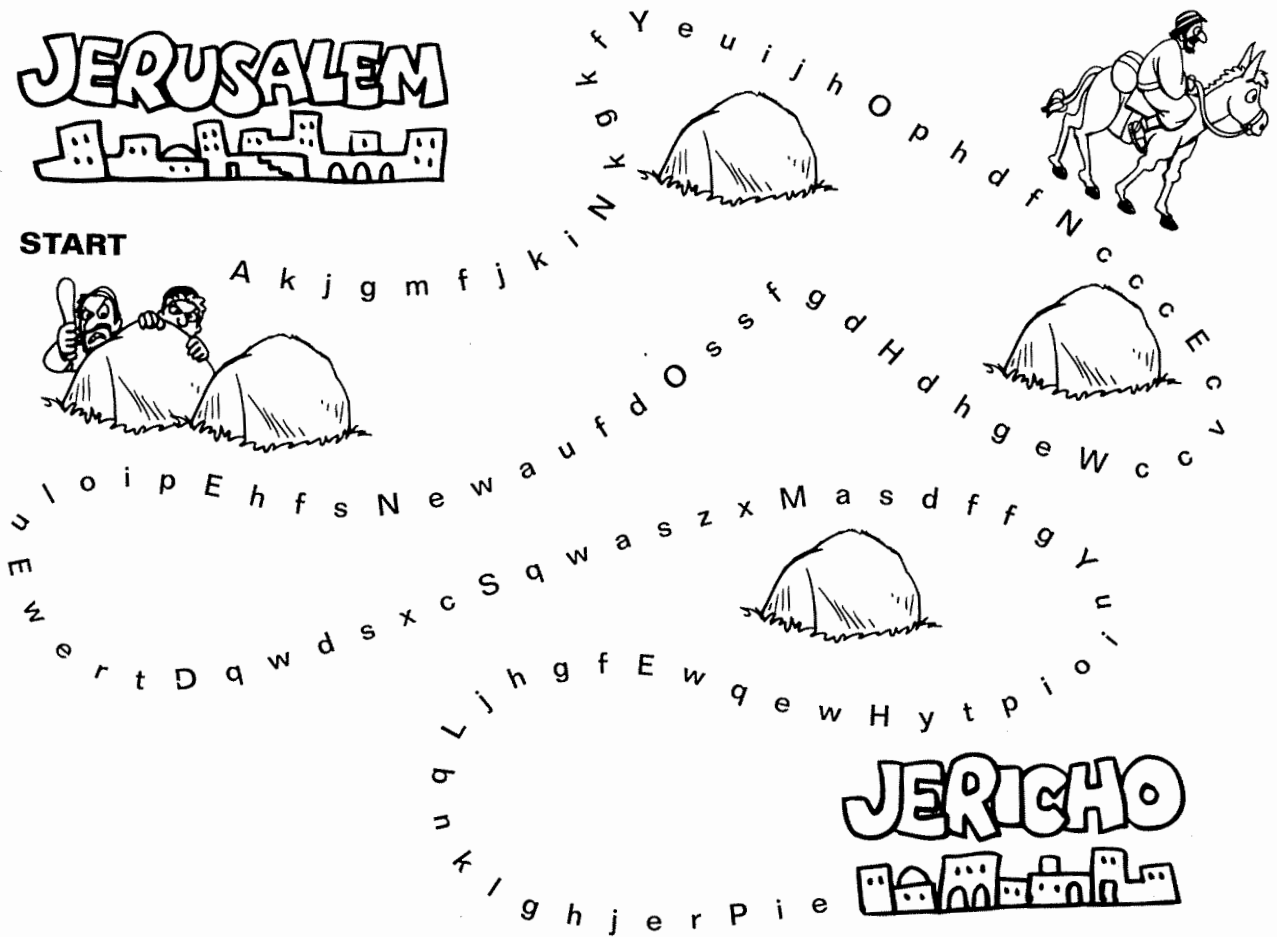
Who Is My Neighbor?

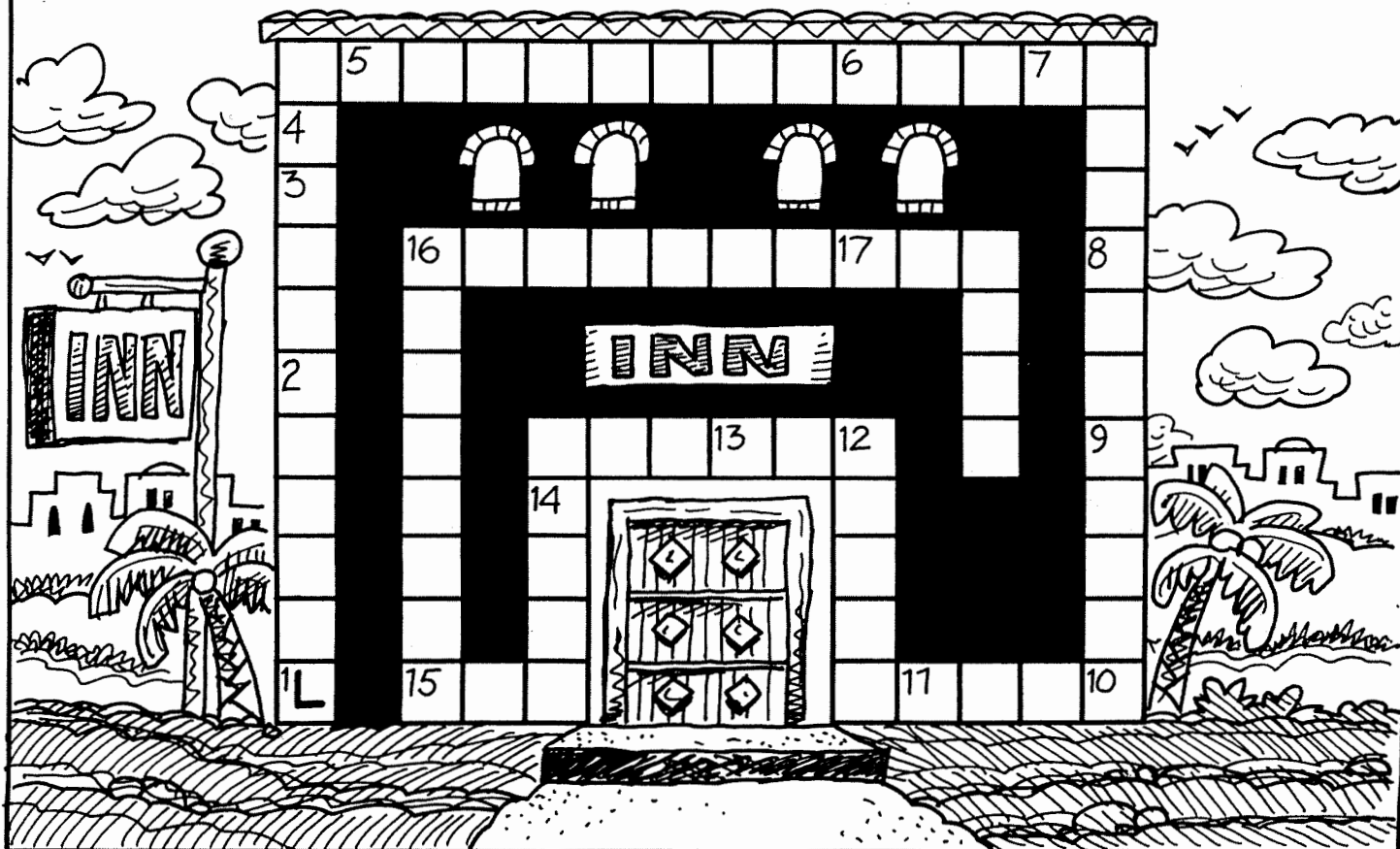
